He committed his life to being a drug dealer . . .

And for twenty years he was good at it!

Zach took his first hit of meth at eighteen. And from that very moment he was hooked. Not only hooked on the drug, but hooked on the lifestyle. He decided that he wanted to be a drug dealer. So, for twenty years Zach became one of the best known drug dealers in south Pierce County.

Over the years, his addiction got worse. He started to feel guilty over the way he used and manipulated people, but it wasn't enough to make him stop.

Then suddenly, the one person who still mattered to him, another dealer whom Zach had considered invincible, was killed in a deal gone bad. Zach knew he wanted out. He needed

help. A friend told him about the Mission's program. When Zach walked through our doors he was desperate and convinced he was beyond hope.

At first he hated it; the accountability, the discipline and the classes. But after a while, Zach realized he was changing. He longed to know more about God. He began to care about how he treated others. And he learned that he actually cared about the well being of those around him!

He started feeling better about himself too, and began to realize that he was a very lonely person. He remembers meeting Christ while at the Mission, and thinking,

"No Christian girl is ever going to want me. Look at me. I'm too far gone. I'm probably the biggest weirdo they'll ever see. I won't have a relationship and that's lonely."

The New Life Program gives Zach a new life!

But God wasn't done with this drug dealer. After working through the program for almost two years, Zach was free! Free from his 20 year drug addiction. Free from his destructive drug dealing and callous attitude toward others. And free from his loneliness.

You see, today Zach is married to Kaleigh and has 2 beautiful little children. And for those who ask him if the Mission's programs work, all they have to know is that Zach graduated from the program 8 years ago . . . and today is still clean and sober, a loving husband and father.

Zach, like so many before and after him, has learned that God uses the Mission to change their lives for good. And not with short-term solutions, but for the long-term.

And for eternity!

"If it wasn't for the Mission, I'd be in prison or killed like my friend. I've watched it give not only myself, but other people a whole new life." - Zach

Yes! It's Cold Outside!

January can be deadly for those on the streets!

Tacoma's average overnight temperature in January is 37 degrees. Combined with our average of 6 inches of rain, we have a recipe for disaster for our homeless neighbors. Exposure and hypothermia become common, and can quickly turn deadly.

Meanwhile, giving takes a big drop in January, making services to neighbors in need harder to maintain.

Still, we open up our doors to allow overflow into our emergency shelter, as hundreds of people look for shelter and safety from the biting cold. But that's not enough.

Our Search & Rescue Van loads up with blankets, socks, sandwiches and other critical-care items and delivers them to desperate people living on the streets, inviting them back to the shelter.

- 61,597 meals served
