

Joseph and Samantha came home to find all of their belongings on the front lawn. Their landlord had evicted them without warning and changed the locks . . . and most of the furniture and valuables had already been stolen from in front of their house!

They had faithfully been paying their rent, but eventually they couldn't keep up. It was bad enough that both Joe and Samantha had lost their jobs, but now they and their three precious children had nowhere to live!

having no place to call home. And living out of a pickup truck was no way to raise kids – especially a six month old baby! Samantha said she felt she had a small taste of what it must have been like for Mary to live in a barn when she had Jesus!

When they thought they had no hope left, a pastor friend told them about the Tacoma Rescue Mission – the only shelter for whole families in Pierce County.

Of course, there was room at this inn, and we immediately took the family in. They were welcomed in to our Temporary Overnight Family Shelter - a partnership with the City of Tacoma and local churches.

Joseph says, "The first day we walked in everybody welcomed us, shook our hands, and said, 'Everything's going to be okay,' then they prayed for us."

Joseph and Samantha's family is now safe and secure . . . and they're focusing on moving forward and doing the best they can for their children;

"We love our kids. This is why we're here!"

"My kids are old enough now, they'll remember this, they're going to say, 'Mom, Dad, do you remember when we were homeless, remember we stayed in the shelter?' I'll have to talk to them about it. I don't want my children to end up homeless, ever again."
