Easter is a time for renewal. And there is no better way of building a relationship and encouraging someone to start over than sharing a meal.



Michelle's addiction got its start in the second grade! And that was just the beginning . . .

Easter means so much to Michelle. Why? Because she understands more than most of us what a restored life

When she was in just the second grade, Michelle entered the foster care system, because both her mom and dad were using drugs. It didn't help that her foster mother was also using, and so Michelle began life surrounded by the drug culture.

She started taking drugs on her own when she was twelve, and by the time she turned fifteen she was addicted and pregnant. From there, her life went downhill . . .

"I thought I could stop and I couldn't stop. It just kept going. Then, the more I thought about it, the more I would do it. '

Michelle's Story Continued

As she grew into adulthood, her life spiraled out of control. When the father of her youngest son was deported – and then murdered – she went over the edge.

Her addiction took over her life. She lost her children and ended up on the streets. Her family thought she was dead. In eight years, she was only clean for 48 days - having washed out of four drug programs in one year.

When she finally came to us last Easter, she hadn't had a meal in days.

But Michelle is no longer dwelling on the past, she's looking to the new life she has found in Christ. Her life began to change almost instantly!

"What those other programs didn't offer was God. That's what I needed. I really think that if I would not have gotten in this program, I would be dead right now."

Today, Michelle has been sober for eight months. God has totally changed her life. She's reconnected with the family who thought she was dead. And best of all, she's becoming a mother to her children once again.

"I told Alex I was getting baptized because God is my Savior and I'm giving my life to Christ. He told me that he wanted to do the same. He's like, "I love God and we can just get baptized together and start a new life."

That's the transformative power of Easter: the chance at a new life, free from the bondage of addiction and suffering. Michelle well understands the true meaning of Easter,

"I just love Jesus telling us that he loves us at our darkest because I lived many years in a dark, dark world. Just to know that he is there and he loves me that much. Because of this program, He really changed my life. It saved my life. I'm so grateful to be here today. Yeah, I'm a new Christian and it's thanks to this program."

For men staying at the mission while recovering from addictions, holidays like Easter can be a big trigger for relapse. Why? Loneliness. Many have broken family relationships that have not yet been restored; others are living too far away from their family.

So instead of being by themselves on Easter and facing that relapse trigger, they are invited into the homes of volunteer families from local churches. We pair two or three men in our New Life Program with a host family, who graciously open their homes and share holiday traditions with them.
