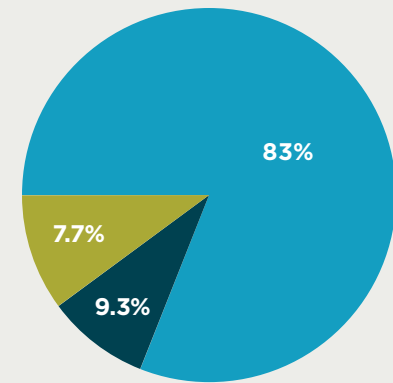

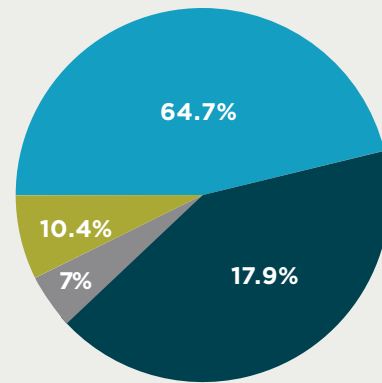

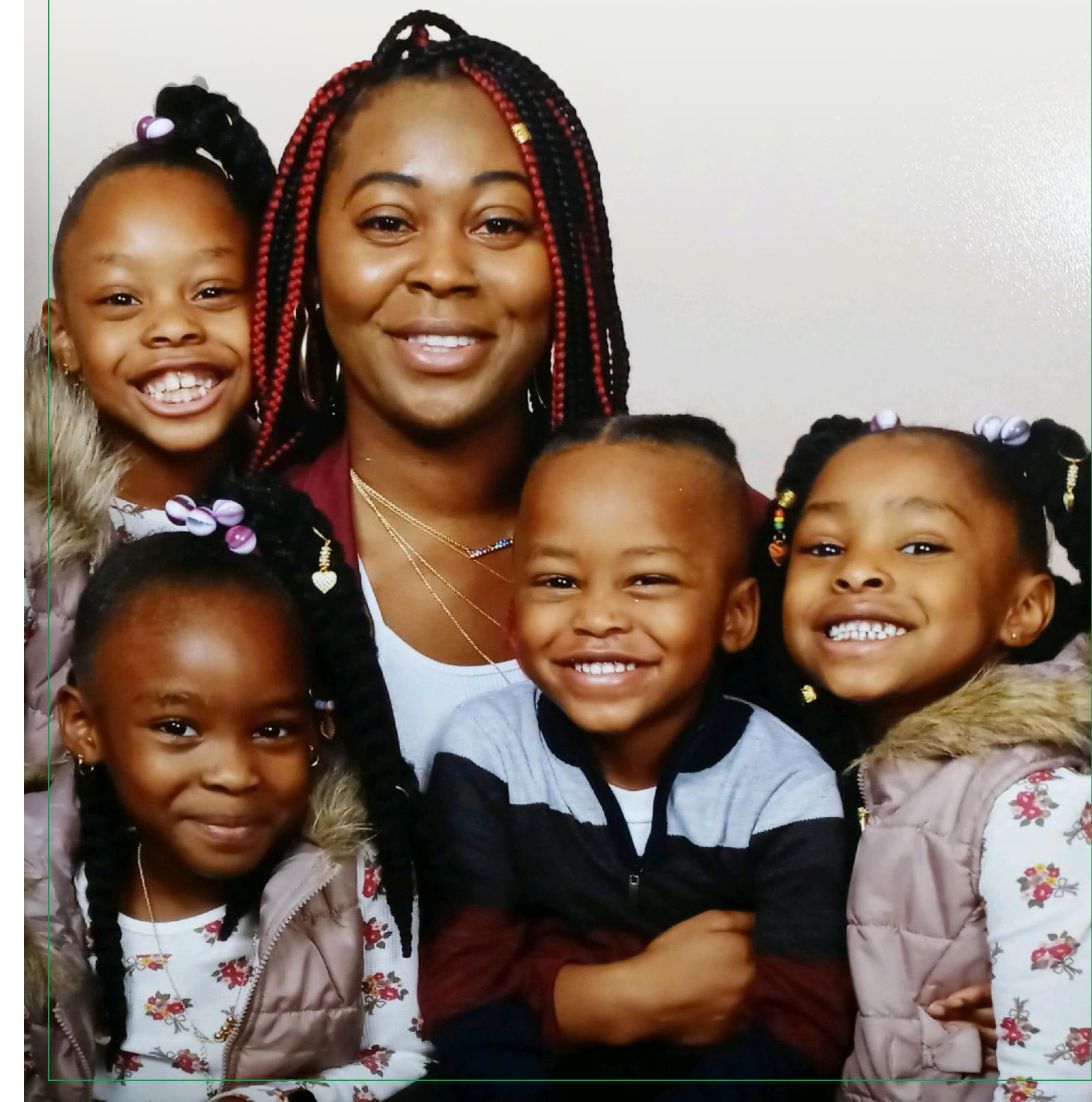

HOW YOUR SUPPORT CHANGED LIVES

Thanks to Your Generosity . . .



3,076 men, women, and children entered the doors of the Mission to receive the life-changing care and resources they needed to escape the streets and rebuild their lives.



3,446 individuals living on the street or encampments were brought food, essential items, and life-changing services through our Street Outreach teams.



253,925 crucial meals were served to our neighbors experiencing homelessness, hunger, and hurt.



366 families and individuals left the Mission and entered permanent housing.



125 men and women received services to obtain jobs or increase income prior to leaving the Mission.



14 men and **12** women graduated from our New Life Recovery Program, overcame addiction, and stepped into new life! Over a 12-month period, they received counseling job training, Christ-centered care, and more.



4,761 hours of one-on-one mentoring, tutoring, and care were provided each month to **83** youth staying at the Mission. Crucial support to help them thrive in school and in life.



1,045 hours of mental health counseling were provided to **95** vulnerable adults and children staying at the Mission.



Kitchen Remodel

When our freezer broke down this past year, we used it as an opportunity to not only fix and upgrade our broken freezer but to renovate our entire Downtown Campus kitchen - what we call “Our Good Neighbor Cafe”.

The renovated kitchen has:

- An additional 1,000 square feet of space
- A new commercial freezer and fridge
- Increased space for volunteers, meal preparation and food storage
- New kitchen appliances

- New ventilation, lighting and electrical
- New shelving, fire doors and additional access points
- Level flooring and foundation
- Structural improvements

These renovations have made our kitchen a safer, more welcoming space for guests, staff and volunteers. And have drastically increased our capacity to prepare and serve more meals to our neighbors in need in the most loving way possible - 3 meals a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.
