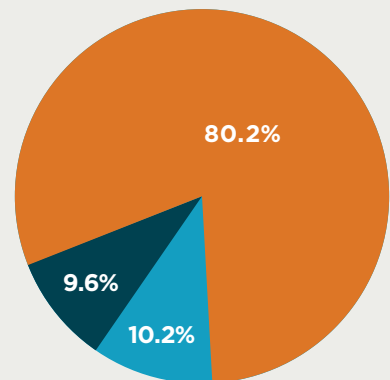

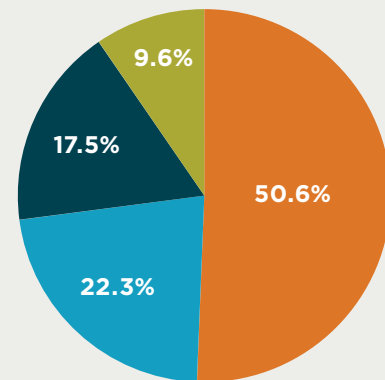

WHAT YOUR SUPPORT ACHIEVED

Thanks to You...



2,881 men, women and children entered the doors of the Mission to receive the life-saving care they needed — a 14% increase over last year!



324,622 life-changing meals were served to our neighbors experiencing homelessness — a 7% increase over last year!



277 families and individuals left the Mission and entered permanent housing.



67 men and women obtained jobs or increased employment prior to leaving the Mission.



49 women and **42** men completed our recovery program, overcame addictions, and found new life! Over a 12-month period, they received counseling, job training, Christ-centered care and more.



348 youth staying at the Mission received mentoring, tutoring and care. Crucial support they need to thrive in school and in life.



712 hours of mental health counseling were provided to **212** vulnerable adults and children staying at the Mission.

The New Women's Shelter is Open!

Thanks to compassionate partners like you, vulnerable women in our community have a safe place to go to escape the dangers of the streets.

It's a place of restoration and transformation. A refuge where women can get nourishing meals, a warm bed and life-changing resources to begin rebuilding their lives.

Since the shelter first opened in June 2020, women in need have been able to escape sex trafficking, reunite with family, secure permanent housing and more.

Thank you for making this urgently needed shelter a reality for women experiencing homelessness. Lives are changing!
